

Warden Message
U.S. Embassy – Dakar
November 25, 2008

This Warden Message is being issued to update American citizens in Guinea-Bissau on the attempted coup d'état that occurred there on November 22, 2008. Shots were fired on the presidential palace and one person was killed. Fighting stopped early in the morning of November 23, 2008, and several alleged perpetrators are now under arrest. In light of these events, the U.S. Embassy in Dakar urges American citizens in Guinea-Bissau to remain vigilant and to exercise extreme caution. Safety precautions should include maintaining good situational awareness, avoiding crowds and demonstrations, and keeping a low profile. Americans should ensure that their travel documents and visas are valid at all times.

Americans living or traveling in Guinea-Bissau are encouraged to register with the U.S. Embassy in Dakar, where they can obtain up-to-date information on travel and security within Guinea-Bissau. Registration may be done online, and can be done in advance of travel at <http://www.travel.state.gov>. Americans without internet access may register directly with the U.S. Embassy in Dakar, Senegal. By registering, U.S. citizens make it easier for the Embassy to contact them in case of emergency.
